

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

CONGREGATIONAL RE-OPENING SURVEY

From the recent survey, we can make some observations about the congregation's desire to return to in-person worship and small group gatherings. One observation is that the majority of people value safety over risk and also that they would cooperate with reasonable guidelines to keep themselves and others safe. However, in a group size of 1,800 people, there are varying degrees of risk tolerance that people are willing to accept. The survey also highlights that the majority of people surveyed are not ready to return to in-person gatherings and worship. The age demographics help us to determine that the majority of those desiring to attend small groups/ Sunday School classes and also attend in-person worship at the first opportunity are in a high risk category. At this point in time, the House & Properties Task Force feels it is necessary to continue to worship online until a safer margin exists.

The team is also working on a phased approach to returning to in-person worship as well as small group gatherings. When the appropriate time comes to return to the church campus, there will be a conscious effort to have dual offerings for those who want to wait a little longer before returning in person. The next report from the team should be available in the near future along with some FAQs on what to expect when returning to the church campus. Thank you for taking time to share valuable information in the church wide survey, and be on the lookout for the next report.





DATA

The House & Properties Task Force sent an electronic survey to all IPC members and a paper survey to our members who are 70 years old and older in June. The task force is grateful to everyone who provided their opinions. As of July 27, we received nearly 500 responses online and by mail and will be using the feedback in helping to make decisions about safe in-person worship and other gatherings.

QUESTION 1

If small groups and Sunday School classes are allowed to meet in the church building prior to the time Sunday in-person worship is allowed, would you attend?





Of 496 total responses, 87% would not attend or are in a High Risk Group. 13% would attend and are not in a High Risk Group.

QUESTION 2

When the first date is announced for in-person worship in the sanctuary, recognizing that worship will not immediately include singing, passing of the Peace, etc., we will...





Would you be willing to attend a worship service at a different time than you typically attend to allow people to spread out so that proper social distancing is maintained?



QUESTION 5


If you have children, how likely is it that you would attend as a family without nursery, children's classes or Sunday morning youth activities? All children and youth would be with their families during worship services.


How often have you watched the worship services online since Sunday, March 15?
