

GUIDELINES FOR USE OF POOL AT CFAF

June 12, 2020

The following are the current general guidelines for members and guests using the pool at the Children's Fresh Air Farm. All guidelines are intended to reduce the risk of COVID-19 exposure and transmission.

1. **Limited Number of Attendees:** The number of attendees will be limited by 50% of the pool capacity. The pool is divided into a beginner swimming area and a swimmer area at the diving board. No more than 20 swimmers in the beginning area and an additional 9 swimmers in the deep end, and no more than 25 people on the deck.

2. Requirements for Arriving Members and Guests:

- a. <u>Social Distancing</u>: All members and guests must maintain a consistent six-foot distance between persons in the pool and also on the pool deck. Family groups that live in the same home may be allowed to swim and congregate closer than 6 feet.
- The Lifeguard(s) will NOT be responsible for monitoring Social Distancing, so volunteers should be on hand to ensure proper Social Distancing is taking place.
- b. <u>Masks</u>: All members and guests over the age of two (2) must wear masks while on church property. Masks are not required while in the pool.
- c. <u>Food</u>: All members and guests are not allowed to bring outside food or beverages to the pool other than bottled water.
- d. <u>Towels/equipment</u>: All members and guests are not allowed to share towels, toys or other pool equipment.
- e. <u>Obligations Prior to Arrival</u>: All members and guests are expected to exercise precautions prior to arrival to reduce the risk of virus transmission. These precautions include, among other things, the following:

- i. asking themselves the following questions before arriving at the church:
 - Have I been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19?
 - Am I experiencing a cough, shortness of breath or sore throat?
 - Have I experienced a loss of taste or smell?
 - Have I had a fever in the last 24 hours?
 - Was my recent temperature over 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit?
 - Have I traveled internationally within the past 14 days?

If the answer to any of the above questions is "yes,' the member or guest should not come to the church.

- ii. if possible, taking their own temperatures before leaving home, which should not exceed 100.4 degrees (Fahrenheit).
- iii. washing their hands with warm water for at least 20 seconds before leaving home;
- iv. using the restroom before leaving home, restrooms are available in the pool house
- v. using personal hand sanitizer upon arrival.
- vi. cover coughs and sneezes.

Attendance of people 65 or older or others especially at risk is discouraged.

- f. Additional Obligations Upon Arrival: Use hand sanitizers and disinfecting wipes as may be made available, and wash hands with warm water and soap when using available within the pool house.
- g. <u>Acknowledgement of Exposure Risk</u>: All members and guests understand and acknowledge that COVID-19 is a public health risk that can result in serious illness or death and exposure can occur despite precautions taken. All members and guests using or entering church property or facilities voluntarily assume all risk of exposure.
- 3. Additional Requests or Instructions of Clergy or Church Staff: All members and guests are expected to follow any additional requests or instructions made by the clergy or church staff.

Because of the fluid nature of state and local requirements and recommendations relating to COVID-19, these guidelines are subject to change without notice. Any exception to the foregoing guidelines must be approved in advance by the church. Rooms or areas of the church available for meetings or gathering and any limitations on the number of attendees will be determined by church facilities management in consultation with the appropriate church oversight committee.
