Wondering Questions:

- 1. What did you hear happened in this story? Is there a part you want to talk about first?
- 2. What do you remember hearing about Martin's childhood?
- 3. Did you hear the part about Martin's mother and father? What did he learn from them?
- 4. How do you think it might have felt to be told you couldn't go to a park or other places because of the color of your skin?
- 5. What do you think it would have been like to march for freedom like those children did?
- 6. How did the children in this story make a difference in helping fight for civil rights?
- 7. Can you think of ways children can make a difference today as we work toward making sure all people have equal rights and feel included?
- 8. What did you learn from this book that you didn't know before? Did this book help you think about something differently?
- 9. How does Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. help show us how to love our neighbors like Jesus teaches us to do?
- 10. Are there things in this story that remind you of Jesus?
- 11. Did you have a favorite part? If so, what was it?
- 12. Is there something you would like to know more about after reading this book?
