Welcome Isaac to IPC! The Athens, Georgia native began his own faith formation at First Presbyterian Church in Athens where he was an active participant in the youth ministry and youth choir. He holds degrees from Centre College, a PC(USA) affiliated college in Kentucky, and a M. Div. from the Candler School of Theology at Emory University.

"I fell in love with youth and the way God was moving in their lives," said Isaac. "Youth ministry is a place for rest and intentional relationships for youth to see and be seen by God and one another."

Isaac is passionate about creating places for youth to ask honest questions and wrestle with the answers. His philosophy of youth ministry involves intentional spaces where youth learn to be leaders, particularly in the worshipping life of the church beyond Youth Sunday.
