"Planting an Acorn of Faith"

Read John 15:1-17 and savor each verse as if it were a favorite food or a delicious dessert.

Reflection Questions and Habits of the Heart

- In today's sermon, Tom Tewell mentioned U.S. Airway's pilot, Captain Sully Sullenberger, who landed his plane on the Hudson River with all 155 passengers safe. Sullenberger said, "For over 35 years I have been making regular daily deposits in the bank of training, education, and experience so that on January 15, 2009, I could make a rather large withdrawal." Question: As you reflect on Sullenberger's words, ask yourself, "What am I making a regular daily deposit in? And what would I like to make a daily deposit in?"
- 2. Author Gordon McDonald said, "If my life is in order, it will be because I have made a daily determination to see time as God's gift and worthy of careful investment." What do you think of McDonald's statement? What habits of mind and heart would you like to put into practice this coming week?
- 3. Take 10 minutes to write a text, an email, or a handwritten note of thanks to someone who has planted an acorn of faith in your life. Tell them as specifically as possible how they have helped you grow in your faith and your life because of their investment in you. Think of a person. Act now!
- 4. Take 5 minutes in prayer and ask God to help you start a new habit or dust off an old habit that you discarded that will benefit your life, your health, or your faith this coming week.
