

#### **INTRODUCTION**

Death can be a difficult subject for one to consider; it may be even more difficult to discuss with our loved ones. However, planning for what is inevitable for all human beings can be not only a significant spiritual experience for you, but also a gift of love for your family and friends.

"The resurrection is a central doctrine of the Christian faith and shapes Christians' attitudes and responses to the event of death. Death brings loss, sorrow and grief to all. In the face of death Christians affirm with tears and joy the hope of the gospel. Christians do not bear bereavement in isolation but are sustained by the power of the Spirit and the community of faith. The church offers a ministry of love and hope to all who grieve.

Because it is difficult under emotional stress to plan wisely, the church encourages members to discuss and plan in advance the arrangements which will be necessary at the time of death, including decisions about the Christian options of burial, cremation or donation of the body for medical purposes. These plans should provide for arrangements which are simple, which bear witness to the resurrection, and in which the Christian community is central." (Book of Order, PCUSA, W-4.1001—W-4.1002)

This booklet is offered as part of our ministry of love and hope to you and your family. It is divided into three parts: Part I is the place where you can record information that deals with some of the practical matters which must be addressed at the time of your death. This includes such things as: general information about your life, education, church and family; location of your bank, passwords and important documents; and military and civic service. In Part II you may set out your wishes regarding burial and memorial services. Part III includes a list of resources in IPC's Lukens Library on death, dying, and grief, as well as a place to list friends to be contacted at the time of your death.

As you reflect upon your life, may you embrace even more deeply the love of God we know in Jesus Christ. May the information recorded in the booklet be more than a catalog of facts. May it bear witness to your faith. There could be no greater gift to your family and friends than this.

#### **PART II**

#### **FUNERAL GUIDELINES**

"The service on the occasion of death ordinarily should be held in the usual place of worship in order to join this service to the community's continuing life and witness to the resurrection. The service shall be under the direction of the pastor. Others may be invited to participate as leaders in the service at the discretion of the pastor."

(Book of Order, PCUSA, W-4.1003)

- At the time of death, a family member should notify one of our pastors or the receptionist at 205-933-1830. Notify the chosen funeral home.
- The funeral/memorial services are worship services which witness to the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The following are the types of funeral/memorial services that are customary at Independent Presbyterian:
  - 1. Public or private burial or inurnment prior to a memorial service in the sanctuary.
  - 2. Funeral service in the sanctuary followed by burial in a local cemetery or inurnment of cremains in our columbarium.
  - 3. Graveside or columbarium service only.
- Specific time and location of services are planned by one of the pastors in consultation with the family and the funeral home.
- Opportunities to gather with friends can be held in the Parlor or Great Hall immediately before or following the worship service.
- The casket is always closed in the sanctuary. If a viewing is desired, it should take place at the funeral home.

## FUNERAL GUIDELINES (Continued)

- Audio visual media and photographs can be displayed at the gathering in the Parlor or Great Hall but not in the sanctuary.
- The casket may be covered with a white pall or a flower spray. The church can provide the white pall for the casket and a smaller one for the cremains urn.
- The family is responsible for flowers to be used during the worship service in the sanctuary.
- Ushers, an organist and printed bulletins are provided by the church for the funeral/memorial service of any church member. Special music (soloists, instrumentalists, etc.) is the responsibility of the family to arrange, in consultation with the church organist.

#### **OUR COLUMBARIUM**

The Columbarium shall be used only for the inurnment of the cremated remains of (a) current and former members of the congregation of the Church, (b) spouses of such members, (c) children or step-children of such members and their spouses, (d) grandchildren of such members and their spouses, (e) parents or step-parents of such members, and (f) current or former ordained ministers of the Church, their spouses, children and step-children, all of which classes of persons shall be deemed members of the Church for the purposes hereof (the Eligible Persons). The Committee shall have authority to make exceptions to the definition of Eligible Persons.

Specific niches for the inurnment of cremains may be reserved for future use by eligible persons upon payment of fees and execution of required documents. Each niche is covered with a bronze faceplate on which the names and dates of birth and death of the deceased are engraved.

#### **Additional details:**

- Cremation Costs The costs of cremation are not covered by fees paid to the church.
- Urn Niches The Urn containing the cremated remains of the Eligible Person to be inurned in the Columbarium shall be obtained from the Church.
- The cremated remains of two (2) deceased eligible persons may be placed in the same niche.
- Only an ordained minister serving Independent Presbyterian Church shall be authorized to direct the burial service. An ordained minister of another church may assist in the burial service at the invitation of the Pastor.
